Questions are based on the Job Seeker Classification Instrument (JSCI) which is a survey used by the Australian Government Department of Education, Skills and Employment and Government funded employment services providers.

This survey should be completed by a young person within two weeks of entering the program as a participant.

Survey methodology

The responses from survey two enable you to track what is working well in a program and what could be done differently, and to measure the outcomes that are being achieved as a result of the program.

Survey two has a minimum of six questions and a maximum of 12 questions. The number of questions that a young person answers is dependent on their individual circumstances. The survey will take no longer than 10 min to complete.

The questions in survey two have been designed to measure how well a program is performing against the features of an effective youth employment program, with a view to improving program design and impact. Providers are encouraged to add additional questions related to technical skill development where relevant. Additional questions should also be added for employability skills relevant to the program.

When analysed against the responses from Participant Survey One (baseline survey) responses from this survey will show whether young people have moved into paid employment and the quality of employment gained.

Defining employment outcomes

In addition to measuring whether young people move from unemployment to paid employment, the Review surveys use the below subjective and objective indicators to measure job quality:

Subjective:

• Job satisfaction

Objective:

- Type of work
- Number of hours
- Use of skills (education, training, qualifications)
- Opportunities for learning and development

Measuring progress to employment

Comparative data will also show whether young people are closer to employment by demonstrating progress against employability factors* important to achieving a successful job outcome.

• Attitude to work

A young person's outlook and approach to learning and work. This includes their general feelings about participating in work and their aspirations.

Capacity to access labour market opportunities

A young person's confidence to find work; the knowledge and skills required to find a job, including understanding how to search for jobs and present themselves to employers.

Career direction

A young person's career direction including their ability to develop a plan for employment

Qualifications, education + training

A young person's enrolment in and attainment of qualifications and accreditations, and further education or training that will help with their future career.

Networks

A young person's connection to people that are likely to support them to find employment




